Lendingkart Finance Limited: Rating reaffirmed for PTCs issued under unsecured business loans securitisation transaction

Rationale

ICRA has reaffirmed the rating for the pass-through certificates (PTCs) issued under the securitisation transaction, Triumph SBL 2022, backed by a pool of unsecured business loan receivables originated by Lendingkart Finance Limited {LFL; rated [ICRA]BBB+ (Positive)}. The pool has seen high amortisation, which has resulted in the healthy build-up of the credit enhancement (CE) cover over the future PTC payouts in the transaction. However, the rating is constrained by LFL's credit profile as the credit collateral (CC) is in the form of an unconditional and irrevocable corporate guarantee provided by the originator. The breakeven collection efficiency is comfortable compared to the actual collection levels observed in the pool.

A summary of the performance of the pool till the December 2023 collection month (January 2024 payout month) has been tabulated below.

Key rating drivers and their description

Credit strengths

• High amortisation of PTCs resulting in healthy build-up of CE cover available for balance PTC payouts

Credit challenges

- High delinquency levels exhibited by the pool in the harder buckets
- Exposed to inherent credit risk associated with the unsecured nature of the asset class; performance of the pool would remain exposed to macro-economic shocks/business disruptions

Description of key rating drivers highlighted above

The performance of the pool has been moderate with a cumulative collection efficiency of 92.5% till the January 2024 payout month. While the monthly collections had dipped over the last few months, the same improved in the December 2023 collection month. The drop in collections was due to lower collections from overdue contracts, which led to some slippages into the harder delinquency buckets. The loss-cum-90+ days past due (dpd) has been increasing over the last few months and remains elevated at 7.2%. However, there was a marginal decline in the softer delinquency buckets (loss-cum-0+ dpd) in the December 2023 collection month. A further improvement in the collections is expected in the next few months by LFL's management.

The pool has seen moderately high prepayments with an average monthly prepayment rate of ~2% and it has amortised by ~65%. There has been no CC utilisation in any of the payouts till the January 2024 payout month. Due to the high amortisation and nil CC utilisation till date, the CE in the transaction has built up significantly with respect to the balance pool principal. Going forward, the pool would remain exposed to the inherent credit risks associated with the unsecured nature of the asset class and any macro-economic shocks/business disruptions.

Overall, the CE available for meeting the balance payouts to the investors is sufficient to reaffirm the rating in the transaction. ICRA will continue to monitor the performance of the transaction. Any further rating action will be based on the performance of the pool and the availability of CE relative to ICRA's expectations.

Performance of past rated pools: ICRA has rated 49 pools originated by LFL. The performance of the live pools (which have completed at least 2 months post securitisation) has been healthy till date with the cumulative collection efficiency in the range of 92-98% for all the transactions. No CC has been utilised till the December 2023 payout in any of the transactions.

Key rating assumptions

ICRA's cash flow analysis of asset-backed securitisation (ABS) transactions involves the simulation of potential delinquencies, losses (shortfall in principal collection during the balance tenor of the pool) and prepayments in the pool. The assumptions for the loss and coefficient of variation (CoV) are arrived at after taking into account the past performance of the originator's portfolio and rated pool as well as the performance and characteristics of the specific pool being evaluated. Additionally, the assumptions may be adjusted to factor in the current operating environment and any industry-specific factors that ICRA believes could impact the performance of the underlying pool of contracts.

After making these adjustments, the expected mean shortfall in principal collection during the tenure of the pool is estimated at 6.75-7.75% of the initial pool principal, with certain variability around it. The prepayment rate for the underlying pool is estimated in the range of 6.0-18.0% per annum.

Liquidity position: Adequate

The liquidity for PTC Series A1 is adequate after factoring in the CE available to meet the promised payouts to the investor. The total CE would be 2.75 times the estimated loss in the pool.

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Rating sensitivities

Positive factors – The rating could be upgraded on the sustained strong collection performance of the underlying pool of contracts, leading to lower-than-expected delinquency levels, and on an increase in the cover available for future investor payouts from the CE along with an improvement in LFL's credit profile.

Negative factors – The rating could be downgraded on the sustained weak collection performance of the underlying pool of contracts, leading to higher-than-expected delinquency levels and CE utilisation levels. The rating could also be downgraded due to a deterioration in LFL's credit profile.

Analytical approach

The rating action is based on the performance of the pool till December 2023 (collection month), the present delinquency levels and the CE available in the pool, and the performance expected over the balance tenure of the pool.

Lendingkart Finance Limited (formerly Aadri Infin Limited) is a Lendingkart Group company, which is registered as a non-banking financial company (NBFC), providing unsecured small and medium-sized enterprise (SME) loans. Lendingkart Technologies Private Limited (LTPL), the technology arm of the Ahmedabad-based Lendingkart Group, holds a 100% stake in LFL. Fullerton Financial Holdings Pte Limited had a 38.16% stake in LTPL as on March 31, 2023. The Group was established in 2014 by one of the co-founders, Mr. Harshvardhan Lunia, and raised funds from FFH, Saama Capital, Mayfield India, India Quotient, Bertelsmann India Investments, Sistema Asia Fund and Darrin Capital Management. Loans are given to micro and small enterprises for meeting their working capital needs. The underwriting is based on the scoring by a proprietary algorithm.
