Rationale

Material Event

On October 9, 2025, SunSource Energy Private Limited (SSEPL) entered into a share purchase agreement (SPA) with Inox Neo Energies Private Limited (INEPL) for the proposed sale of its equity interest in certain special purpose vehicles (SPVs) housing the solar energy projects of the group totalling 290 MW. This sale transaction also includes complete transfer of SSEPL's equity stake in Isharays Energy Private Limited (IEPL) along with the other SPVs in the co-obligor structure, namely, Isharays Energy One Private Limited, Isharays Energy Two Private Limited, Isharays Energy Three Private Limited, Suryaurja Two Private Limited and Suryaurja Four Private Limited, to INEPL. The completion of the transaction is subject to the fulfilment of condition precedents, other terms outlined in the SPA, and the receipt of all necessary regulatory approvals as required under the applicable law.

INEPL is an independent renewable energy power producer with 157 MW of operational capacity and ~1.1 GW of under-construction capacity. The assets under INEPL are majorly spread across Gujarat and Maharashtra. INEPL is part of the INOXGFL Group with Inox Clean Energy Limited (ICEL) owning a majority stake in INEPL. ICEL is engaged in the business of developing and operating utility scale wind, solar, and hybrid power projects through INEPL as well as manufacturing solar cells and modules through Inox Solar Limited (ISL).

Impact of the Material Event

The ratings of IEPL are being placed under watch with developing implications, following SSEPL's announcement of the proposed sale of its entire equity stake in IEPL along with the other SPVs in the co-obligor pool. Subsequently, ICRA has taken note of the proposed divestment of IEPL to INEPL. ICRA will interact and understand from the new management their approach towards supporting the acquired assets, both operationally and financially, and will continue to monitor the developments and resolve the rating watch as more clarity emerges on the announced transaction.

About the company

IEPL was incorporated on September 5, 2020 and has installed a 21-MWp solar project at Ramnathapuram, Tamil Nadu. The power offtake has been contracted with multiple C&I customers. The project achieved COD in June 2024. SSEPL is the holding company of IEPL, with a 74% equity stake and the remaining stake is being held by the C&I customers.

Co-obligor Group

IEPL is funded by a common single lender under the co-obligor group with five other entities, namely, Isharays Energy One Pvt Ltd, Isharays Energy Two Private Limited, Isharays Energy Three Private Limited, Suryaurja Two Private Limited and Suryaurja Four Private Limited. The co-obligor group houses open access solar PV projects with an aggregate operational capacity of 120.9 MWp and under-construction capacity of 15 MWp. These solar projects operate under the group captive model. Under this model, the company develops solar power plants through an SPV with part equity being infused by the offtakers (min upto 26%). Upon commissioning, the SPV earns the tariff-based revenue for the power generated by the plant and supplies it to the captive C&I customers.
