ITI Asset Management Limited: Ratings reaffirmed

Rationale and key rating drivers

ICRA has reaffirmed the ratings of various debt schemes of ITI Asset Management Limited (the asset management company; AMC). The ratings have been reaffirmed following ICRA's monitoring of the credit risk profile of the month-end portfolio position of these schemes. The credit risk scores for these schemes were comfortably within ICRA's benchmark limits for their current rating levels.

Mutual fund (MF) ratings incorporate ICRA's assessment of the creditworthiness of a debt MF scheme's investment portfolio. These ratings are a symbolic representation of the credit risk in the underlying investments or the degree of safety regarding the timely receipt of payments from the investments made by the MF schemes. The ratings do not indicate the AMC and/or any of its scheme's willingness and/or ability to make timely redemptions to its investors. The ratings do not address market risks and hence should not be construed as an indication of the expected returns, prospective performance of the MF scheme, and the ability to redeem investments at the reported net asset value (NAV) or volatility in its past returns, as all these are influenced by market risks.

ICRA's assessment of debt MF schemes are guided by the credit ratings of the individual investments and the relative share of the schemes' allocation towards the investments, besides the maturity schedule of such investments. ICRA's MF ratings are not a reflection on the quality of the management of the AMC or its financial performance, reputation and other business practices including investment strategies, pricing, marketing and distribution activities. Furthermore, the ratings are not a reflection of whether the AMC or the fund is compliant with the applicable regulatory requirements.

The credit matrix is a tool used by ICRA for analysing the investment portfolio of the debt MF schemes by assessing the portfolio's aggregate credit quality while reviewing the credit quality of each underlying debt security. The portfolio's weighted average credit quality is compared with a benchmark credit score corresponding to the higher of the weighted average maturity of the scheme's portfolio or the maturity predefined by ICRA for the scheme category. The rating outcome corresponds to the rating level for which the portfolio's weighted average credit score is less than the benchmark credit score associated with the rating level. Further, the lowest rating of the investments of the scheme acts as the floor for its rating.

Once an MF scheme is rated and the rating is accepted, ICRA reviews the underlying investment portfolios for the credit scores on an ongoing basis. To this end, ICRA relies on the information provided by the AMC and/or publicly available sources. ICRA reviews the MF ratings on a monthly basis or earlier, if required, which involves an evaluation of the rating corresponding to the portfolio credit score in relation to the existing rating outstanding. If the portfolio credit score meets the benchmark score for the existing rating, the rating is retained. If the portfolio credit score has a negative breach from the benchmark credit score for the existing rating, ICRA communicates the same to the fund manager/product manager and/or other officials of the concerned AMC before the end of the next month, and provides 30 working days from the date of such communication to

bring the portfolio credit score within the benchmark credit score for maintaining the existing rating level. If the investment composition of the fund is realigned to bring the portfolio credit score within the benchmark credit score, the rating is retained. However, if the portfolio continues to breach the benchmark credit score for the existing rating level, the rating is revised to reflect the change in the portfolio’s credit quality.

In case of sharp breaches of the benchmark credit score (for instance due to a multi-notch downgrade in the underlying investment) and/or if ICRA believes that the breach may not get rectified within a month of the ongoing review, the rating is generally corrected immediately without giving a month’s time for rebalancing the portfolio. If the AMC corrects its portfolio, post the rating downgrade of the scheme or the credit score improves in any manner subsequent to the downgrade, making the scheme eligible for an upgrade, ICRA may consider a rating upgrade only if the credit score is maintained consistently for a period of at least three months.

For ITI Overnight Fund – ICRA could downgrade the rating of the scheme if the credit quality of the underlying investment deteriorates, leading to a breach in the threshold for the rating level.

For other debt MF schemes – ICRA could downgrade the ratings of the schemes if the credit quality of the underlying investment deteriorates or the size of the assets under management (AUM) declines, which may result in an increase in the share of lower rated investments, leading to a breach in the threshold for the rating level.

About the company

ITI Asset Management Limited (ITIAML), the AMC for the mutual fund schemes of ITI Mutual Fund, is a subsidiary of The Investments Trust of India Limited (ITI Limited; formerly known as Fortune Financial Services (India) Limited). As per ITI Limited’s annual report for FY2024, it has a stake of 45.15% in ITIAML while 30.11% is held by ITI Credit Limited, a subsidiary of ITI Limited. ITI Mutual Fund Trustee Private Limited, a wholly-owned subsidiary of ITI Limited, acts as a trustee of ITI Mutual Fund. The AMC’s average AUM was around Rs. 10,716 crore¹ (excluding Domestic Fund of Funds but including Overseas Fund of Funds) during the quarter ended September 30, 2025.

ITI Group

ITI Group is promoted by Mr. Sudhir Valia. It was initially engaged in the capital market businesses of retail and institutional broking, apart from investment banking. In 2013, the Group diversified into lending businesses. Mr. Valia has an established presence in real estate development and construction through his companies. ITI Group is present in institutional and retail

equity research and broking, asset-based lending (fintech small and medium-sized enterprise (SME) lending, vehicle loans, etc), investment banking, alternative investment funds (long-short equity, real estate, venture capital) and fixed income broking and retailing. It has more than 3,553 employees across 295 branches in India.

ITI Liquid Fund

Launched in April 2019, ITI Liquid Fund is an open-ended debt scheme that invests in debt and money market securities with a maturity of up to 91 days. The investment objective is to provide reasonable returns, commensurate with low risk, while providing a high level of liquidity through a portfolio of money market and debt securities. The scheme's AUM stood at Rs. 66 crore as on October 31, 2025.

ITI Overnight Fund

Launched in October 2019, ITI Overnight Fund is an open-ended debt scheme. The investment objective is to provide reasonable returns, commensurate with low risk, and a high level of liquidity through investments made primarily in overnight securities with a maturity of one business day. The scheme's AUM stood at Rs. 11 crore as on October 31, 2025.

ITI Ultra Short Duration Fund

Launched in May 2021, ITI Ultra Short Duration Fund is an open-ended ultra-short-term debt scheme, which primarily invests in debt and money market securities with the Macaulay duration of the scheme to be maintained between 3 months and 6 months. The scheme's AUM stood at Rs. 184 crore as on October 31, 2025.

ITI Dynamic Bond Fund

Launched in July 2021, ITI Dynamic Bond Fund is an open-ended scheme primarily investing in debt and money market securities. Given the underlying nature of the scheme, the Macaulay duration tends to be dynamic. The scheme's AUM stood at Rs. 117 crore as on October 31, 2025.

ITI Banking & PSU Debt Fund

Launched in October 2020, ITI Banking & PSU Debt Fund is an open-ended debt scheme that invests in debt and money market instruments, primarily securities issued by banks, public sector undertakings and public financial institutions and municipal bonds bearing relatively higher interest rate risk but lower credit risk. The scheme's AUM stood at Rs. 36 crore as on October 31, 2025.

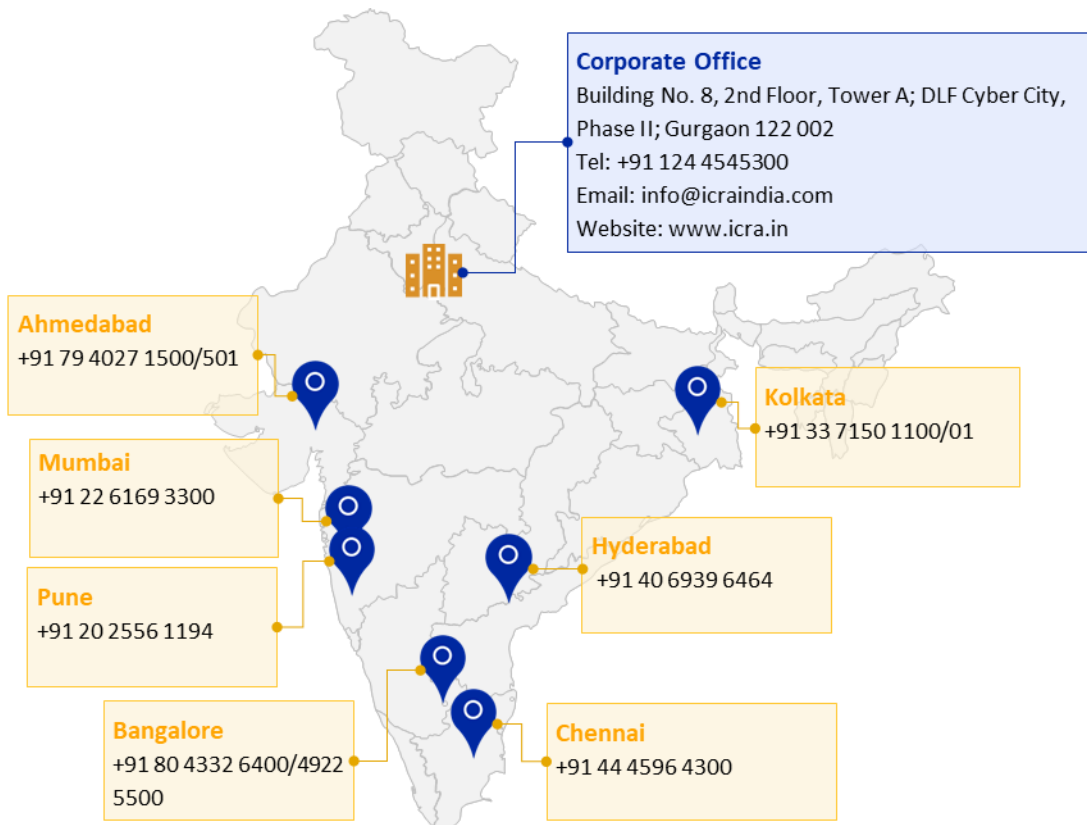
