Rationale

ICRA has kept the Long-term and Short-Term ratings of Shreeram and Sons in the 'Issuer Not Cooperating' category. The rating is denoted as "[ICRA]D; ISSUER NOT COOPERATING/[ICRA]D; ISSUER NOT COOPERATING".

The rating continues to remain under "Issuer Not Cooperating" is because of lack of adequate information regarding Shreeram and Sons's performance and hence the uncertainty around its credit risk. ICRA assesses whether the information available about the entity is commensurate with its rating and reviews the same as per its "Policy in respect of non-cooperation by a rated entity" available at www.icra.in. The lenders, investors and other market participants are thus advised to exercise appropriate caution while using this rating as the rating may not adequately reflect the credit risk profile of the entity.

As part of its process and in accordance with its rating agreement with Shreeram and Sons, ICRA has been trying to seek information from the entity so as to monitor its performance. Further, ICRA has been sending repeated reminders to the entity for payment of surveillance fee that became due. Despite multiple requests by ICRA, the entity's management has remained non-cooperative. In the absence of requisite information and in line with the aforesaid policy of ICRA, the rating has been continued to the "Issuer Not Cooperating" category. The rating is based on the best available information.

Incorporated in 2012, Shreeram and Sons (SAS) is an apparel manufacturing firm, which caters to both the export and the domestic markets. It manufactures and exports apparels to the US, Korea and European countries. It specialises in manufacturing of shirts and bottom wear for all age groups and for both men and women. It procures fabric from customer-approved suppliers based in India. It then partners with the client to design the product or manufactures the same based on the specifications provided by the customer. The company has its manufacturing facility in Peenya, Bangalore, with a capacity to produce 12 lakh pieces per annum. As Bangalore is a garment manufacturing hub for woven clothes, the firm gets access to skilled labour. The firm has certification of Worldwide Responsible Accredited Production (WRAP) and Supplier Ethical Data Exchange (SEDEX), which are the world's largest independent certification programs mainly focused on the apparel, footwear, and sewn products sectors. This helps the firm in showcasing its focus on quality, safety and security to potential customers.
